


FEDERAL & STATE PRISON POPULATION, BY OFFENSE

Federal, 2011 State, 2010





NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN FEDERAL PRISONS FOR DRUG OFFENSES, 1980-2011






POPULATION UNDER CONTROL OF THE U.S. CORRECTIONS SYSTEM, 1980 & 2011

INTERNATIONAL RATES OF INCARCERATION, 2011











NUMBER OF PEOPLE SERVING LIFE SENTENCES, 1984-2008





NUMBER OF PEOPLE SERVING LIFE WITHOUT PAROLE SENTENCES, 1992-2008




